

**Fall Teacher Assignments**

Mr. Burns summarized the teacher / grade assignments, including the exciting news that RCV was able to secure 3 teachers for 1<sup>st</sup> grade! This means Ms. Maloy is able to return to RCV (moving to 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade), and also means our specialists (art, music, PE teachers) will be restored to full time status at RCV! Hooray!!!

Teachers (and approximate class sizes) for each grade are listed below:

\* Reading initiative teacher Ms. Pomponi will help teach 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade literacy (normally she would also help teach 1<sup>st</sup> Grade literacy, but not this year due to the very small 1<sup>st</sup> Grade class size)

RCV will be getting increased ESOL support – both Mrs. Kallinock & Mr. Behrens will be teaching ESOL this year. We were also assigned 1.5 teachers to Instrumental Music (Mrs. Branch + a newcomer).

Compacted math is going to happen in the fall. It will be taught by Mrs. Winnokur for 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> grade, and by one of the 5<sup>th</sup> grade teachers (TBD) for 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> grade.

This year, a few grades tried departmentalization / switching kids between different teachers based on subject matter. Next year, 1<sup>st</sup> Grade will switch back to single teacher format due to the likelihood of online learning – they’ll have a very small class size anyway, so engagement should be relatively easy. 5<sup>th</sup> Grade is still discussing whether or not to departmentalize.

Due to the likelihood of online learning, RCV and other MCPS schools will be switching to Eureka math and Benchmark reading curricula next year.

**Summer Classes**

Mr. Burns gave an update on what to expect for summer classes. Mrs. Polsinelli (RCV’s staff development teacher) is the lead teacher organizing the summer classes for rising 1<sup>st</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> graders. So far 158 kids have signed up! Enough kids have registered that they’ll be able to run every type of class for every grade, but kids are welcome to continue registering until tomorrow, June 30<sup>th</sup>. #### **Other Items:**

There was discussion about the importance of trying to find ways to reduce the social-emotional learning gap for incoming kindergarten students, who learn so much through physical interaction. Reducing these and other types of learning gaps will be a focus of the instructional leadership team over the summer. Mr. Burns suggested RCV might be able to release the incoming kindergarten class assignments earlier than usual to allow kindergarten families to connect in advance of the school year.

The PTA will also be holding Covid planning meetings over the summer to discuss how to adapt our activities for the upcoming year (for example, how to safely host summer playdates for incoming kindergarteners, how to identify alternatives to the "normal" social events, assemblies, etc).

***All RCV parents, new and old, are welcome join in these planning meetings – we really need the hive mind mentality to brainstorm solutions! Drop in to whichever meetings you're able to attend – don't feel pressured to attend them all!***
